Four Corners Regional Education Cooperative #1 (REC #1) began operations in October 2019, when the executive director was first hired. This report provides an overview of services and activities offered during the 2019–2020 fiscal year beginning at that time. **Comprehensive Navajo Dual-Language Development (CNDL)**

Start-up of the Kellogg Foundation-funded project to support early childhood providers, Navajo-English dual language curriculum and program development, and enhance career pathways. Project activities are specific to one member district, but applicable across all members.

**Dossier Development Strategies and Writing: Professional Learning**

Full-day professional learning from state dossier facilitators, plus writing strategies for clear written communications. Hosted by Farmington Municipal Schools. Available to all teachers from REC #1 member districts.

**Elementary Math Mastery: Professional Learning Events**

Two two-day professional learning events for elementary teachers. Focus on strengthening understanding of mathematical concepts and developing instructional strategies and practices. Hosted by Farmington Municipal Schools and Gallup-McKinley County Schools. Available to teachers statewide.

**Mock It Till You Rock It**

Mock interviews for high school students engaged in career development programs from REC #1 districts. A full day of interviews, plus feedback, with local industry representatives. Supporters: Farmington Chamber of Commerce and San Juan College.

**Next Gen Career Technical Education**

Supporting Aztec, Bloomfield, and Zuni career pathway development, through resources, professional learning, and access to courses. NM PED funded.
